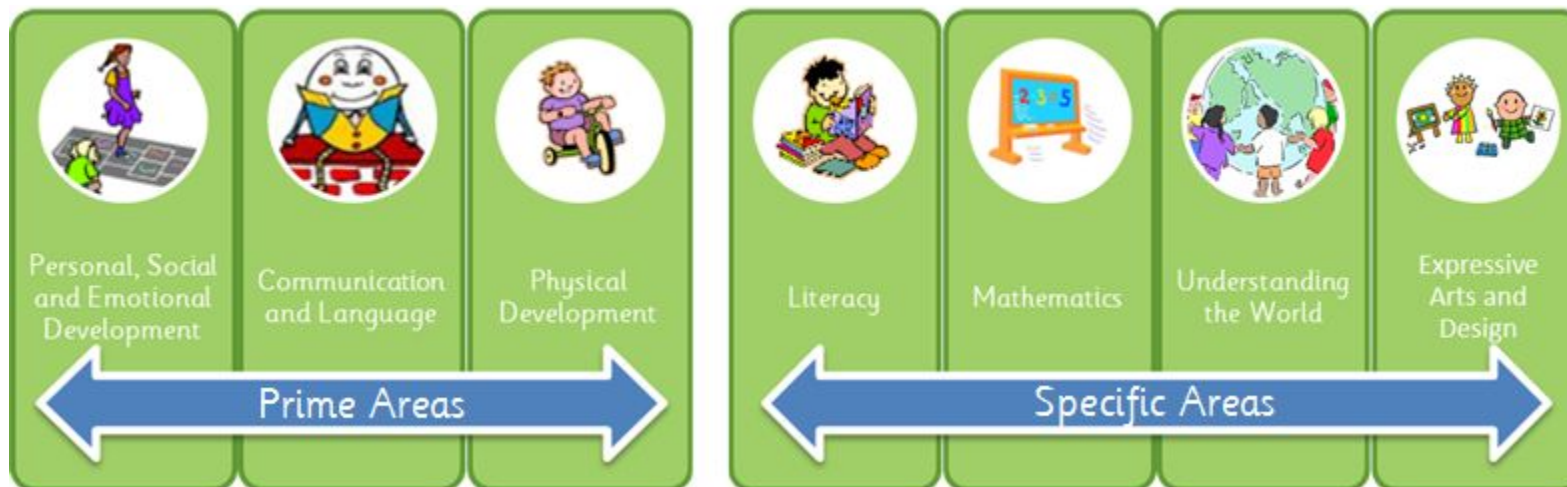


Early Years Foundation Stage



Personal, Social and Emotional Development. (PSED)	Prime area - This area develops social skills, attitude to learning, self-confidence, self-awareness and supports them in managing feelings and behavior.
Communication and Language (CL)	Prime area - This area develops skills such as listening and attention, understanding and communicating with others.
Physical Development (PD)	Prime area - This area teaches children about their bodies, how to be healthy and develop skills such as control, movement, strength and using equipment safely.
Language (L)	Specific area -This area develops skills in reading and writing, through the teaching of phonics and supporting children to apply these skills in all areas of their learning.
Maths (M)	Specific area -This area develops skills such as counting, addition, subtraction, problem solving, understanding shape and measuring.
Understanding of the world (UW)	Specific area -T his area develops a child's understanding of the environment and their community, the world and technology around them.
Expressive Arts and Design. (EAD)	Specific area - This area develops their imagination and the skills of singing, drama, making, painting and using different resources.
