

Primary PE & Sport Premium

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government in England is providing funding to primary schools for them to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This funding goes directly to schools and is based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. The funding can **only** be spent on sport and PE provision in the school.

This report will be updated at the end of each financial year to identify the success of the initiatives put in place and the impact they have had.

At Barnham Broom we received £11,813 for the academic year 2014-15.

How is the Sports Premium grant to be spent?

Our objectives are:

- To improve our provision for PE and sport
- To develop provision for high quality sport during playtimes and lunchtimes
- To increase the opportunities for all pupils to access a wide variety of PE and Sports
- To support teaching staff in delivering consistently effective PE lessons
